## Notes:

- 1. *Ch<sup>s</sup> Kanaina* Charles Kana'ina was a man of chiefly lineage who married Miriam 'Auhea Kekāuluohi. Their son, Willian Charles Lunalilo, became the sixth monarch of the Hawaiian Kingdom.
- 2. *Kamalani* Mr. Levi Chamberlain was a member of the second company of missionaries. He was the superintendent of secular affairs for the mission and served as a missionary teacher.
- 3. *Lunalilo* William Charles Lunalilo, the son of Charles Kana'ina, was four years old at the time of this letter and a student of the newly founded Chiefs' Children's School. He later became the 6th king of the Kingdom of Hawai'i.
