

Dear Sister W.

Waiman Sept 30th 1837

I am sorry to hear by your letter to sister Knapp that your health is not good then you will be under the necessity of being very careful with regard to your health especially this year.

Does the climate agree with you? Is it very warm at your station? I suppose you are keeping house. Have you a good house? Of what is it built? How many natives have you and how do you get along with them? Probably you advancing rapidly in the language by this time. We arrived here 4 weeks ago next Monday Mr and Mrs Bailey left here last Tuesday for Kohala as Mr B. wished to be on the ground to attend to building our houses. They are living at present in an old house near the Meeting house about 4 miles perhaps from the place where we wish to take our station. We hear that the Governor is not willing that we should take that station. The head woman wishes us to stay near the meeting house. She has however sent to the Governor to see if we may take the station at Kapaau where we wish to. We do not like the station near the meeting house as there are but few people there and a great deal of cold wind and rain.

We expect to stay here until we can have some kind of a house to live in. We cannot tell how long that will be. Probably however Mr Bliff will spend some time in Kohala to assist in building. We expect to build native houses. There is some severity here some who have heretofore been stubborn are inquiring ~~and~~ Brothers had an inquiry meeting today A number have been propounded for admission to the church a number more are to be propounded tomorrow some of them are children I hope they will adown their profession. The Governor has given out orders to have a new meet-
