

Lakaincluna Aug. 30th / 58

Dear Sister,

Received yours of the 7th
a few days since and was very much
surprised to find that you had
received nothing from us. I had
written twice and Husband to
B. the once certainly if not twice.
We wrote once by way of Wainea
and once by a vessel going direct
by to Hilo. — Not long since we
received letters from B. I used
sister Lucia expressing great
surprise that we had not writ-
ten to them. We both wrote but
the letters were kept down at
Lakaincluna by overnight and not
sent. You may get mine during
the year. When Mr. H. was at
Wainea B. handed him a
letter for me from sister Anna
which was few months old.
It seems rather strange how-
ever that you should receive the
other letters and not ours.
I am glad to hear your health
is improving. I hope you will

soon regaining your usual health & strength. - Allice is, and has been much better since I came to this place than formerly. Husband's also. He is improving. Does not complain much of his throat now, though he finds it necessary to be careful and not expose himself. Neither is he very strong. He is in school in the forenoon has a school for the miss children one hour in the afternoon and has other things to attend to for the school when he is home. Has some work to do in making things we need here which we found at Waimea and therefore no more for them at present. I mention these things supposing you will like to hear what we are doing and he will not probably find time to write now.

I feel just like reminding you of your request when we supposed we were going to Honolulu and what you said respecting those who wrote us, that they wrote as if you knew all about what was going on. I could not avoid

thinking of it when I received
yours. You said nothing of the
marriage of Br L. and I had
not heard when he was marri-
ed nor by whom till last week
I saw it in the Kumer Hawaii
Perhaps however you had good
reasons for being silent on that
subject. I have heard but very
little from Hawaii since we
have been here nothing concern-
ing Hilo except what you
wrote. Two notes only from W.
I will say no more and your
excuse this. — I now have
sewing school with the miss.
children every afternoon and
that is all the teaching I do at
present. Hope in due time to
do more. But I am pilikiai
loa i ka hana. Have not as
much assistance from domestics
as at W. The woman assists me
in sewing and is more thorough
in her other work than the one
we had there but the man is
much inferior. — Sister M.
Donald's spent three weeks with
me. Her husband was absent

a little more than five. She is keep-
ing me company. We are likely to
have political times here. I think
we shall not be scattered about as
much as you in Hawaii were last
year. Do not know what will be done ^{yet}.
