Maria P. Chamberlain journal

1850

Tuesday Jan 1. 1850. I dined at Mrs Clark's in company with Miss Ogden Messers Fuller Whitney(!) Ruggles & Lewis called towards evening on Mrs Armstrong & Mrs Dominis & Mrs Lee Found the latter preparing to go to a ball -- /Jan 3d Wrote a joint letter to Warren & Evarts. Mr Rogers family went up to Holo kai/

Jan 5 Baked the communion bread for the native church and assisted Mr Clark to cut it up

Sabbath 6 Attended divine worship at the Chapel in the morning & the communion at the native church in the afternoon Mr Clark distributed the bread and Mr Andrews assisted in making remarks & in distributing the wine

Monday 7 Attended Monthly Concert with Miss O. at Mr Armstrong's -- Made some calls this A.M. and by the energetic efforts of Mrs Hooper \$100 has been collected for Mr Holden's children

Jan 12 Prepared communion bread for the Mission church Attended the preparatory(!) lecture preached by Mr Dole at 4 P.M. Was very much mortified to find the school house in such a sad condition It had not been cleaned since it had been rethatched and whitewashed. After meeting Mrs Clark and I went over with natives & children and brushes & shovels water pails & mop rags and cleaned the house

Sab 13, A cloudy P.M. with showers Met however at the school house and had a solemn & I trust not unprofitable season A few strangers present

14 Mrs Hall had been confined to her bed six weeks with a very prostrating diarrhoea

Saturday 19 Mr Asa Thurston called and spent the night with his cousin Goodale Sabbath A wet day I did not attend public worship

Monday(21) I consented to board Mr T for the present. Miss Ogden went over to stay with Mrs Clark

Friday Jan 25 Received a letter from Maran(!) also a long one from the Board The families met at our house and it was read Mr D was very much excited -- Mr Anner arrived this A.M. Mr D's child is very sick I called in the evening Felt much embarrassed on finding Mrs D in a state of great excitement in the presence of her newly arrived brother

Jan 26 Saturday Wrote to M J and M A via San Francisco. Mrs Dimonds babe was thought to be dying I went over and spent three hours there. The child revived before I came home Miss Ogden spent the night there

Tuesday Jan 29 Mrs Whitney arrived in the Carolus, Capt Dunbar 123 days from Boston Passengers besides herself Mrs Parsons & son Mrs P was received at

Mr Armstrong's Mr & Mrs Whitney have come to board with us.

Feb 1st Friday Mr Hitchcock & Dr Bullard(!) called to spend the evening Dr B found an old acquaintance in Mrs W. He is a brother of Henry W Beecher's wife.

Sat Feb 2 Miss Bernice & Mr Bishop called on Mrs W -- Had Capt D to tea Sabbath 3 I attended the native Service in the morning & walked down to the chapel Mrs W rode in my little hand wagon. Mr B walked home with me.

Tuesday Feb 5 Mr Clark and Miss Ogden and the three little orphan children of Mr Holden took passage with a foreign Capt in the Sophia(!) for Lahaina

Feb 8 Friday Mrs W and myself received a present of a barrel of pilot bread and half a barrel of flour from Capt Dunbar I desire to regard this as a special favor of Providence in supplying our wants. Flour is selling for 25 & \$30 per barrel

May I ever put my trust in the Lord & not forget his benefits.

Mr Taylor is down here on business He rooms with Mr G--le and occasionally takes a meal with us.

Sabbath Feb 10 I went to hear Mr T preach morning & evening at the Chapel at the close of the service in the evening Mr Grout had a convulsion(!) and was carried out of the house he appeared to be in great distress.

Monday 11 Mr G called with Mr. Taylor He appeared as one who had come out of a stupor but said he felt comfortable. Had Mr Spafford to tea this evening. The gentlemen all went to Temperance meeting and left Mrs W & myself to entertain him.

Tuesday 12 Mr & Mrs W and myself dined at Mr Penhallow's. In the evening we had Mr Davis & Dr Huit(?) to tea.

Wed 13 Mr Taylor took breakfast with us and sailed at 3 PM for Lahaina.

Friday Feb 15 Mr Thurston informed me that he was going to leave to board at Mr Rogers I have felt deeply interested in this young man and have done for him as I could wish to have others do for my son in similar circumstances

Saturday Feb 16 Mrs Dimond's babe almost 12 months old died about noon Mrs Clark was with her I went up and spent three hours this PM

Sabbath day 17 Very strong wind -- Did not attend public worship but attended the funeral of Mrs D's babe at ½ past 9 AM There were a number of parents & children present. Messers Damon & dole(!) conducted the exercises

(Feb. ? Dined with Mr & Mrs Whitney at Mrs Penhallows)

Feb 18 Monday Had Mrs Penhallow & children to tea

Mr Emerson called & introduced his Nephew Mr Hazleton

He wished me to take him to board till he can get a passage to San Francisco  
 Wed 19 Mr H took his meals & lodging with us -- Mr Dimond conducted our evening  
 meeting Mr E has a bad cold

Thursday Letters were recd(!) from the Missionary rooms I recd one from  
 Dr A & Mr Hill After meeting went over to Mr Clark's to hear the letter of the  
 Board read

21 Had Mr Emerson Mr Hazeton(!) & Dr Barstow another acquaintance of Mr E to  
 tea. The weather is windy rainy and uncomfortable.

Saturday 23 Busied myself washing and baking Mr Whitney paid me for a  
 months board

24 Sabbath Went to native service & heard the Rev Mr Kekela preach a native  
 youth educated by Mr Hunnewell Attend the service also at the Chapel

25 Monday Mrs W and myself calld(!) on Mrs Dimond and Mrs Hill The health of  
 the latter unimproving

26 Mr G has introduced the game of Chess into this house, not much to my satis-  
 faction

27 Wednesday Mr G paid me for three months board. -- Mr Parker is over from  
 Kaneohe and conducted the exercises of our meeting -- Subject ye are not your  
 own The Meeting was a very good one.

Feb 28 Mr Parker called in the evening also Mr Park. I am trying, what time I  
 can find <sup>uninterrupted(?)</sup> by cares & company to write a little to my absent  
 children

March 1. Busily employed in the cookroom most of the day. Recd(!) 3/4th of a  
 barrel of flour from Mrs Hooper I would notice the kind hand of the  
 Lord in providing for our wants. -- Mr Hitchcock (fm(?) California (!)  
 made a call in the evening to bid us good bye

2d Sat Mr Hazleton returned from Waialua & is stopping again with us I have  
 finished a letter to Mrs Hill & Warren & have commenced one to the girls.

3d Sabbath: I attended service at the Chapel twice and the native service  
 in the morning.

5 Tuesday Dr Barstow called this PM Expects soon to sail for San Fran co(!)

6 Wed Mr Hazelton left and went on board the Massachusetts which is to sail  
 to morrow for San Francisco

10 March Sab. Communion of the Mission church at the School house. The Bark  
 Maria arrived from San F-co and brought Mr & Mrs Ladd & the new consul  
 Mr Allen to the islands

- 11 Monday Mr Whitney obtained Mr Lowell Smiths carriage and took Mrs W and myself out to make calls. We left home at 4 PM and returned at 6 having called at Mrs Dominis (where Mr & Mrs J Ladd are boarding) Mrs Hooper's, Mrs Lathrop's, Mrs Damon's, and Mrs Wood's
- 13 Wednesday Mr Bailey took tea and spent the night. He has unfortunately lost all his property by the fire on board the brig Brothers on their way to San Francisco
- 16 Saturday We have had an abundance of rain the past week wind from the South
- 17 Sabbath Cloudy Rain thunder & lightning Did not feel well Kept my bed till noon -- had very heavy rain in the evening
- 18 Monday The King's birth day coming on Sabbath this day was celebrated instead His Majesty received foreign company in the A M and the Queen had a levee in the evening The weather unsettled clouds and rain
- 19 Tuesday My own birth day. I have lived 47 years. How short they appear in the retrospect. Dear husband laid in the grave two sons & two daughters widely separated from me How like a dream is my life. Hope my dear girls have arrived at their destined port to day.
- 20 Wed No Meeting. A very wet night.
- 21 Had Mr & Mrs Ladd and Mr & Mrs Lee to tea Asked advice of the latter on some important business. Had a pleasant visit
- 22 Friday Mr Bailey has commenced teaching singing School for his own pecuniary advantage, as also for the benefit of the youth in this place. I send James. Messers Whitney & Goodale attend.
- 23d Messers Dimond & Anner called this evening.
- 24 Sabbath Went to native service in the morning and heard Mr Clark Attended at the Chapel & heard Mr Damon and in the afternoon heard Mr Armstrong at the native church
- 25 Strong wind blowing in from the sea An English ship was blown on the reef I saw the masts being cut off & falling into the water It was a sad sight. The Capt was admonished of his danger but like Capt Moore of the Patatisco(?), could not see it till it was too late
- 26 I was called up at 3 A.M. by Mr Whitney the rain pouring down torrents Dr Huit(?) was called in & about half past ten Mrs W became the happy Mother of a son The rain contined(!) to pour down all day Isabella stayed at Puna-hou -- It was my baking day Mrs Clark was present
- 27 Our Meeting this evening was attended by Messers Hawley & Baily(!) Mr Clark

made remarks on the 1 Psalm.

- 28 Mrs C and I made a call on Mrs Patteson(!) the daughter of Mr Allen but did not find her at home. In the evening Mr Allen himself called on me & was introduced by Mr John Ladd
- 30 Sabbath. I attended Service at the chapel with Levi A crowded house Mr D is making efforts to organize a church The sermons for several Sabbaths have had refference(!) to it. Attended the Native(!) service in the P M
- April 1st Monday The <sup>Mr</sup> Strailor(?) arrived. transacted(!) a business matter with Mr Hall and recd(!) his note -- Attended the M Concert at Mr Armstrongs
- 2 Tuesday Mr Whitney paid up his bill Mrs W's improvement is slow - a little feverish to day.
- 3 Wed Mrs Castle and myself were the only females at our meeting & but(!) few others attended
- 4 Dr Huet(!) left for San Francisco I sent a letter to the girls
- 5 Friday a rainy day Isabella spent the night at Punahou
- 6 Prepared communion for the native church. In the PM wrote a noteto H. Hill Esqr
- April 7 Sabbath Did not attend public worship to day Was lame in my feet. Mr Clark had communion both in the morning and afternoon.
- 8th Monday My time is very much occupied having only the assistance of one native and the additional care of Mrs W and the babe Dr Huet called to day and took leave Expects tomorrow to sail for San Francisco.
- 13 Mrs H sent me word that she expected to sail next Monday for San F(!) and I made some cookies for her voyage Isabella called down to see her
- 14 Sabbath A church of 12 members was organized at the Bethel and Mr Damon was installed the pastor The Lord's supper was celebrated in the afternoon. Mrs Whitney came in to dine with us.
- 15 Monday We had Mr Mitchell & Mr Hutchings to tea, also Mr Alexander.
- 18 (Thursday) We had a company of 21 to sit down to tea We had all the boarding schollars(!) and some of the children in the neighbourhood We had family worship immediately after tea. The large & interesting circle of children & youth united in singing How shall the young secure their heart & guard their lives from sin & Mr Whitney led in prayer. The evening was spent in plays of an intellectual character in which Mr & Mrs Whitney & Mr Goodale took a prominent part A few pieces of music were sung and at half past nine the children left to walk in the light of a beautiful moon to Punahou
- 20 (I wrote to my daughters but failed of sending by Judge Turrel(!))

- 21 Sabbath I attended the native Service in the morning & heard Mr Armstrong, and at the Bethel at noon & in the evening.
- 23 Tuesday I made calls down town & called at a milners shop
- 24 Wed Had a very thin evening meeting -- Isabella spends the night at Punahou to attend singing school. -- Mr Ruggles has been taken quite ill with a fever Has watchers.
- 25 Thursday. M.J's birth day - I called over at Mr R's to see Mr Ruggles His case is considered a critical one. The Doctors fear an affection(!) of the brain. His feet were cold. I applied mustard to them & sat with him two hours, during which time he was unable to express a single connected thought. At noon I returned(!) to my room to plead for the conversion of my beloved daughter and to intreat(!) the Lord to spare the life and restore the reason of the son of a missionary who I fear is unprepared for death & eternity. To the Sovereign grace of God I commend him & also my own dear child.
- 26 Friday Mr Ruggles has had two convulsions and was thought to be dying in the last Dr L. entertains very feeble hopes for his life He had watchers all night
- 27 Sat Mr R. had a comfortable night and his reason has been restored. Dr. Newcomb has ordered quinine to be given him for fever, which has had a good effect. I called & found him much better. He had dressed himself & walked out this A.M. which appears rather presumptuous(!) His mind probably is very weak
- 28 Sabbath I attended the native service twice and once at the Chapel. Mr R's case has dwelt on my mind & I have tried to commend him to God He continues O that he would now attend to the One thing Needful.
- 29 Monday I was greatly astonished this A M to see Mr R walking up the Depository stairs He appears weak in both body & mind
- April 30 Tuesday Levi T's birth day He has entered into his teens. I prayed with & for him My only hope for him, for all my children is in God's covenant mercy & converting grace.

Mr Hutchings called last evening & begged me to take him as a boarder. He has been to Hawaii & on his return had an attack of fever & ague. He appears refined & polite in his manners & compassion would not allow under present circumstances to make any objections, but I do not feel prepared to assume this additional family care for any length of time.

May 1st Had a very thin evening meeting.

May 2 Had Mr Hall's family, who are soon going to move out of our neighbour-

hood, to tea Mrs H's health appears much improved

May 3 Attended the examination at Punahou School a number of the brethren & sisters were present and a few invited friends Was pleased to witness the improvement made in speaking singing & composition Spent the day very pleasantly. Mr Gulick took tea with us.

May 4 Mr & Mrs Whitney sailed for Kauai about ½ past four P M

5 Sabbath I walked to church with my children I also attended the native Service in the afternoon

6 & 7 Busily engaged in writing letters to send via San Francisco by Mr Lewis & Orremel(!)

May 8 The Charles arrived and brought Miss Bishop to her native land I called on her in the afternoon at Mr Castle's She attended the evening meeting and there were more present than usual.

9 Mr B and his daughter called -- they expect to morrow to leave for Ewa

11 We had a preparitory(!) lecture at the School house, which was very much out of order & troubled me very much.

12 I attended the native service in the P M and the communion

13 & 14 Busy writing to my dear children

15 May Had the pleasure of hearing that the Montreal arrived in N B (This information afterwards proved incorrect)(!) the 14 of March and that the names of the passengers were printed Mr Lewis & Mr O Gulick took passage about noon for San Francisco by whom I sent a small box of letters & \$40 in gold to my children.

17 Had Mr Thurston to tea. A short but pleasant visit

16(!) Made some calls down town called on Mrs Harris a stranger whose husband is absent and who has had an iron chest carried out of her house & has been robbed of some hundreds of dollars -- I also called on a dress maker from ( ? ) whose husband is at California She is in destitute circumstances hardly able to obtain a support O for a grateful heart for the mercies that I am permitted to enjoy I have recd(!) an unexpected favor to day.

17(!)Sabbath. Had headach(!) -- did not attend the morning service Attended native worship in the afternoon Mr A preached.

22 Messers W & G rode to Ewa & returned at 10 the same evening

May 26 I attended service at the chapel and there had notice(!) that the funeral of Mr Tobey would be attended at 5 P M Walked down with Mr W to the hospital to see his corpse He was very much emaciated Should not have recognized him ----- Sad, very sad would his friends have felt could they



have seen him.

- 27 Wed Packed & sent a box of crockery to Kailua Had Maternal Meeting at our house
- May 30 Mr H sailed for Maui
- 31 Friday Mr Allen called with his son who has just arrived from the US in the Eliza Warwick Young Mr A was a classmate of Evarts at W m's(!) College He gave me much gratifying information respecting him
- June 1st Saturday John Gulick returned from San Francisco.
- 2 I attended Service at the Chapel but not at the stone church
- June 3 Attended Monthly Concert at Mr Armstrong's Mr Wilcox made a report on the Moravian Mission
- June 4 Tuesday Mrs Clark's family & ours had a pic nic(!) at the head of Manoa valley There were present besides our families Dr & Mrs Newcomb & two children Miss Mills Messers Baily(!), & rogers(!) & Whitney. We had a pleasant day & a very pleasant time
- When we returned in the evening, found Mr Hutchings had returned from Maui, -- Mr Gulick took tea with us -- Mr Bishop & Miss Bernice were married in the evening Her parents & relatives opposed them till the lasts & refused to witness the ceremony.
- 5 Wed evening Meeting as usual Miserable discords in the singing.
- 6 Thursday Decided to let Isabella go to Maialua with Mr Gulick, and S'arah(!) Clark Cannot obtain such a horse as I could desire but have decided to let her try old Gray.
- 7 Friday Devoted the whole forenoon in preparing daughter for her visit. The (!) left at 20 minutes past 3 P.M. As she has not practiced riding much on horseback I feel a Mother's anxiety on her account May a kind Providence preserve her from harm & return her in safety.
- June 8 Mr Bailey called & cleaned the piano.
- 9 Sabbath. attended native service in the afternoon & service at the Chapel in the evening. -- James' birth day He is 15 0 that he may now put away youthful folly and begin to live for heaven & a blessed eternity
- June 10 Monday Received letters from my four oldest children just two months from their date The girls arrived in Boston the 4 of April and on the 7th & 8th had an interview with their brothers. They were all in good health blessed be God for this new expression of his goodness to me & Mine
- 12 Mr Emerson is over from Maialua He conducted our Wed evening meeting He has invited Sarah Clark and Isabella to make them a visit

- June 15 Mrs Judd & Mrs Bates called --
- 16 (Crossed out)
- 13(!) I have been much occupied in writing, Mr H. has requested me to have the estate of Mr C settled
- 14(!) Mr Bailey had his singing class meet at our house -- Mrs Parker was present Isabella returned safe & sound and though she rode from Waialua a distance of 36 miles she was not much fatigued Both she & Sarah attended the singing School
- 15 Saturday Mr Parker took breakfast with us. -- Mr Whitney paid me 24(!) for board He left in the evening for Kauauai(!) to bring home his wife & child. Evening Miss Bishop came to spend the night and to stay over the Sabbath
- 16 Sabbath day Miss Bishop & I attended the native service and walked from the Stone church to the Chapel. Mr D preached the annual sermon for the Hawaiian Bible Society. Miss B and the Misses C walked down to Chapel in the evening. Mr. F. walked home with us
- 17 Miss B spent the day with Mrs Lathrop 18 She returned with her father
- 19 Messers Emerson & Baldwin are both at H-- They conducted our Wed evening meeting
- 20 Mr B took breakfast with us with Mr E.(absent)(sleep)(!) Called with Mr Clark in the evening at Dr Wood's to make some inquiries respecting Warren
- 21 Sat Mr Allen the Consul call to certify the documents that have been prepared for the US
- 23 Attended chapel only in the evening -- Very warm weather Isabella commenced attending the Bethel Sunday School.
- 24 This was my baking day and Martha Ann's birthday
25. Tuesday Spent the day at Punahou. Had a very pleasant visit When we returned in the evening we found Mr & Mrs Whitney at home
- 26 Mr Bailey took tea and attended the evening meeting Mr Baldwin still at H Made long remarks at the meeting.
- 27 Mr Baldwin took breakfast with us. Levi, Isabella and myself rode up into the valley to spend the day with Mrs Bates. Had a delightful visit Called on Mrs Lo Smith Mrs Janion Mrs Jonstone(!) Mrs Andrews and Mrs Bishop (the bride) Mrs Marshall, Mrs Snow and on the gentleman of Rose BAnk
- 29 Mr Castle sailed for Kauai -- Mr & Mrs Whitney took tea at Mr Armstrong's
- 30 Sabbath day Mr & Mrs Whitney carried out their infant to Chapel to be bap-

tised His name is Hervey Ely In the P M Mr Damon had communion service at 3 o'clock

- July 1st Miss Mills called and inquired how we were going to spend the 4th of July and proposed having a pic nic at Punahou.
- (July 2d) Baked in the morning At four in the P M Mr G harnessed(!) Mr C-s horse and took Mr & Mrs Whitney and myself up to Mr Andrews to call on the bride & groom!
- July 3 Was not well Head disordered Was obliged to be absent from the Wed evening Meeting

There is a Moravian Missionary here. Mr Mertzing. He belongs to the expedition going in search of Sir John Franklin He goes as interpreter being acquainted with the E (!) language. He attended the prayer meeting

- July 4th Most of the families at the Station & Mr Merzing(!) went up to spend the day at Punahou. I did not, having no inclination nor spirits to join the company. This morning Puali, a good old faithful woman who lived with us 14 years, died. I trust has entered upon a blessed immortality. She had a very amiable temper and ever appeared(!) like a Christian. She manifested her attachment(!) for our family to the last.
- July 5 After breakfast Isabella & I attended the funeral of Puali. She was buried in the yard of Kahaupio. Mr Clark made a prayer over the grave.
- July 6<sup>th</sup> Saturday Recd letters & papers from Warren by the Chilo 100 & 24 days from Boston

Prepared bread for the communion of the native church and assisted Mr Clark in cutting it up

- 7 Sabbath Attended the native morning service and in the P M the communion and the chapel in the evening Very warm weather Felt extremely languid Was quite tried by Mr. H busy out till 11 o'clock
- July 8 Recd a letter from Mrs H also a valuable present -- Attended the M concert at Mr A's with Mr & Mrs H--
- July 9 Tuesday Called with Mr G in the evening on Mr Ii and Mrs Sarah(!) It was an interesting and beautiful sight to see them in their own house with a family of five children around them -- Every thing in the parlour being elegant(!) and in perfect order
- When we returned Mr Damon call'd to introduce a son of Dr Beecher. at(!) present a sailor on board the (blank)
- July 10 Mrs W and Isabella spent the day at Dr Lathrop's Had some conversation with \_\_\_\_\_(!) in the evening Meeting as usual but more thinly attended

11 Thursday The Mission recd a letter fm(!) Dr Anderson I heard it read at Mr Clark's - Mr Castle still absent at Kauai - Mr Cook(!) too much occupied to call a meeting of the Station Some new ideas having originated with Messers A & H(?) on board the Montreal respecting the taking a new station or stations on some of the islands in the Pacific have given the Board considerable thought

1211.(!) A day of domestic toil & providentially supplied with native assistance

13 Saturday Had the pump fixed by a foreign carpenter Find myself wearied in body & mind Am glad that the Sabbath is nigh Return O my soul unto thy rest

14 Sab Attended native service in the P M and heard John Ii exhort Walked to chapel in the evening -- heard Mr D preach Subject Naaman the Syrian

15 Monday 15 Mrs Clark was taken sick -- Mrs Ives whole family have the opthalmia

16 Tuesday Had Messers Thurston & Castle to tea besides our own family Spent the evening very pleasantly.

July 17 Warren's birth day -- He is 21. His mind is decidedly made up to return to the islands -- May he a decided Christian a good soldier of the Cross We had a Methodist minister Mr Horn and an elder Mr Crookes at our prayer Meeting Both took part in the exercises

18 Thursday Went with my boys to the taylor's to have some clothes measured & cut -- (in conversation) Mr & Mrs Dole arrived Spent two hours in the evening with Mr \_\_\_\_\_ (!)

July 1850

19 Friday Had a call from the Misses J who were unusually friendly ---

21 Sabbath Attended the Native Service in the PM and at the Chapel in the evening My Mind was much affected by a retrospective glance of the past scenes of the year

22 We have four carpenters & two natives at work shingling the roof

23 I made a visit with Mr & Mrs Whitney and Messers Thurston -- & G Isabella at Punahou It was a beautiful Moon light evening and we returned about nine o'clock.

24 Wed Mr Hutching moved into Mr Clarks house & took board at Mr Cook's(!) Our evening meeting was very small indeed.

25 Batchelors(!) Ball at the Commercial Hotel.

26 Friday Received letters from Warren & the girls Had a call from Mr & Mrs Lee in the evening

27 Sat. Miss Smith and several of the boarding scholars arrived this A M and

took breakfast with us.

28 Sab Attended Native service in the P.M. & at the chapel in the evening  
Text from Rev.

29 This by the day of the month, & yesterday (sabbath) the anniversary of  
dear husband's death A day of solemn thought & retrospection Read to the  
children some of the written charges of their dear father for them Was  
much affected in the evening by prasing(!) some of his writings

30 Tuesday My dear husband was laid in the ground just one year ago. May  
life be like his -- The Lord watch over & convert my sons The Lord enable  
me to be kind, reasonable & faithful to thee With out the aid of divine  
grace I shall labour in vain

All the family went but myself & the baby. Prayer Meeting omitted.

Aug. 1st Captain Carter died last night at 12 o'clock & was buried this P.M. --- As  
a fool dieth, so died he in the delirium tremens.

- 3d Saturday Mrs Whitney and little Hervey took passage at 4 this P M in the Don Quixotte for Maui and Kealakekua After they left Isabella & I made calls down town We called upon Mrs Dudoit & the Misses Corney at Mrs Dominis also on Mrs Lee We called on Mrs Von Pfister at Mrs Howland's and at Mrs McKee's & at Dr Woods
- 4 Sab Attended Morning Service at the Chapel Mr D preached from Rev He endeavored(!) in his Sermon to improve the providence which had suddenly removed one of the old residents from this community.
- 5 Monday The house having just been reshingled, I spent the day in cleaning the garret -- Tho' very tired, I walked over to Mr Armstrong's to attend the Monthly Concert
- 6 Tuesday Had a pleasant con---n(!) with Mr \_\_\_\_\_ on a particular subject -- to be my last effort unless the spirit moves me to speak again.
- 7 Wednesday A remarkable event -- A total eclipse of the sun It was so dark that it was necessary to light a lamp in the house We all went out into the street to look at it Jupiter & Venus were conspicuous and about 12 other stars. There was a sudden change in the atmosphere from mid day to mid night The whole face of the sun was covered, but there were beautiful(!) soft silver rays encircling the outer edges of it -- It was a sublime sight approaching the awful. I was glad when it passed off & felt as never before, the beauty of the Wise King's remark Truly the light is sweet & a very pleasant thing it is to see the sun.
- About 4 PM I walked out to call on Hannah Hooper who is ill -- I also called on Mrs Jarret & Mrs Henderson When I returned found Messers Jonson(!) and Wilcox at our house. They both stopped to tea. Evening Meet, as usual but very few present remarks on the phenomena
- 8th Thursday cleaning the chambers & attending various domestic concerns.
- 9 Friday I kept James at home this week from school who has removed & cleared away all the rubbish of the old roof It has been a hard task but he has

completed it

10 Sat Had the mats taken up and the children gave the parlor floor a thorough washing We replaced the mats & returned the furniture before evening. I was obliged to be absent from the preparatory lecture at 4 PM

Mr Bond (the Unitarian Minister) made a very pleasant social call, but he intended it for Mrs Whitney

11 Sabbath Communion of the Mission church at the native School house Services conducted by Mr Dole -- Attended chapel in the evening.

12 Monday evening We all attended the agricultural Meeting in the Chapel A Society was organized taking the name of the Royal Agricultural Society

Mr ----- left off drinking tea & coffee James commenced attending school

13 Tuesday A very long day All the children absent -- Mr Wilcox took tea & spent the evening Mr Emerson over to attend the Ag--al(!) Meetings

14 Wed Another long day but I shall become accustomed to it I am glad of the leisure it affords to attend to long neglected duties

Evening(!) Meet small Mr A's four children Mr & Mrs Clark & daughter Mr Cooke Mr Castle & Mary & our family present Address to the children by Mr A

17 Have been writing to day. Sent off six pages to Maria Jane & Martha Ann -- Had Rev Mr Dwight to tea

18 Sab Mrs Paty was confined with a daughter. Mrs Armstrong was present

I attended service in the evening at the chapel & heard Mr Dwight preach his sermon on influences Text No man liveth to himself

Aug 1850

19 Monday Mr D called & took breakfast with us. In the PM he call'd to say good bye & I furnished him with some provision for his homeward passage

 Mr Clark's -- Mr & Mrs J Ladd made me quite a long call

4 Wed: Mr Bailey took breakfast with us and soon after took leave expecting  
 to sail this P M from Lahaina & from thence to the U.S. I sent a letter by

A salute from Punch Bowl was given to express the joy that was felt on the return of the absent ones. Minute guns were afterwards fired as a token of respect for President Taylor the intelligence of whose death has just been received. -- I recd letters from M & W (We that is myself & children attended Sunday School concert at Mr Castle's(!))
- 12 Thursday 12 Capt W has come home every day to dine this week consequently I am more occupied in the kitchen than usual -- Mrs D & Miss Mills call'd this A.M., the latter accepted an invitation to spend the day with Mrs W, and as she brought no work, she very kindly made me two collars
- 13 Friday 13 Baked & fitted off Mr Bond for Hawaii  
Evening Mr Thurston had a singing School at Mr Castle's
- 14 Sat Mrs W has a boil on her arm -- In addition to all my other cares, I made & changed six poulices for her. Had a free & faithful conversation with Mr \_\_\_\_\_ in the evening
- 15 Sab Was sent for by Mrs P who fears she shall have a broken breast After attending the afternoon Service I call'd(!) down to Mrs P and found her better Attended Chapel in the evening Mr Thurston has taken charge of the singing or has performed the Organists part & led the choir much to the satisfaction of this congregation

5 Saturday Bought (or Mr C did it for me) a cord of wood for \$14 which has not yet been taken care of & causes me anxiety

23 Wed No meeting With the erection of the sign Castle & Cooke expired our prayer Meeting Whether it will revive with the return of one or two

absent ones from the station is a question

Called with Warren upon Mr & Mrs John Ii

24 Took dinner with Warren & Isabella at Punahou. Returned early in the P.M. to help W pack up his things to send by schooner to Waialua

26 Sat Morn W returned to Waialua station

Read in bedstead this eve which I shall dispose of, perhaps to Mr ----- with whom I had a long conversation

27 Sab Did not attend the native service. Attended Chapel twice. Evening Mr T was very solemn. Text: What wilt thou answer when he shall call thee to judgment!

28 Made a social call on Mrs Clark- Mrs P & W were there spending the day

29 The anniversary of my dear husband's death. O that I could know more of the world of spirits where he has gone! What does he know? O that I could live constantly under the impression that I am in the presence of spirits & be especially careful not to grieve the Holy Spirit

Recd letters to day from W & M.

30 Wed Isabella & I dined at Mr Whitney's. No Meeting in the eve -- Mr Bartos store was burnt about half past nine with one or two small houses -- a ball at mana kilika

31 A great National holiday. A great effort was made to celebrate it. An Eng Frigate was here a soiree given at the Palace. Music and dancing kept up till past 11 o'clock. No children were allowed to be present. Mr Clark returned to day

Aug 1 Isabella went to visit at Mr Hall's & attended the Chapel Singing School in the evening

2 Saturday Have been house cleaning to day -- The Lahaina & Holo kai boys arrived. Also Mrs Jonson & eldest children from Waioli. An other interesting date to me Aug 2. ----- is twelve years & nine month old

3 Sab Went to the stone church to hear Mr Clark & walked down to hear Mr T twice. Discourse in the A.M. on building on a sandy foundation. Evening

4th Monthly Concert at Mr Clarks. Revd Messrs T & Andrews present. Dr Judd & family. Quite a full house

5 Tuesday Isabella & I dined at Mrs Dominis. We made several calls after 4 P.M. When we returned we were told that Mr Castle had come home but the words seemed like idle tales but they affirmed that it was true. We went to see & found it was even so. Smith assisted Mr D in the communion service

21 Thursday Called on Mrs Whitney who was expecting soon to sail for Hawaii Recd a most unexpected favor. Sat up til midnight writing to my absent ones --

Mr kindly(!) offered to send the daguerreotypes with his by Mitchell's Express.

22 Friday Had a call from Mr Holman -- About 12 o'clock was alarmed by the flames of a native house enveloping me as I lay on my bed with a frightful light At first I supposed the fire might be a house in our our(!) yard but soon I convinced myself that it was at some distance It was the house of Kini Haka

- 4 Sat Made communion bread for the native church -- Had a call from Capt Gillett

- 7th Tuesday Mrs Crabb called -- Had Capt Fales(?) to tea & Warren arrived from Waialua There is a revival among the men on board his ship -- Mr D returned with his family to Molokai

26 Sab Attended morning Service at the Stone Church Staid at home from Chapel to give the Seamen room attended the Bethel in the evening

28 Tuesday The last day in the term Had no means of going up to visit the School

29 Wed Levi Rode over to Waialua to visit Warren I borrowed a horse & saddle from John Ii

30 Miss Bishop who was at H on a visit returned with Mr & Mrs Dole

Nov 1 Sat Sarah Jonson(!) spent the day It was one of busy domestic care to me

Nov 2 Attended service at the Bethel A new Choir has been got up composed entirely of Male voices Mr G has returned. Singing not very interesting. Mrs Parker was over took meals with us & slept at Mrs Castles She & I attended the Bethel morning prayer meeting She hopes that the Lord has revived his work in her husband's field at Kaneohe. An Episcopal Service was conducted in the 2d story of Mr Howe's Anchor Room One of Chalmer's Sermons Read by Mr Wyllye payers(!) read by a Mr Turner

Nov 3d The Anniversary of my leaving the land of my birth and Isabella's birth day. We (she & I) dined at Mr John Ladd's I called on Mrs Von Pfister Mrs Whitney Mrs Snow Mrs Thompson & Mrs Patterson -- In the evening she had a present of a beautiful camphor desk from Mr Goodale O for gratitude to God for the friends & for all that conduces to promote our happiness -- James Isabella & I attended the H Concert at the chapel(?)

Nov 4th Tuesday Levi with the Waialua boys returned Also Mr Emerson He stopped at our house Mr Goodale spent the evening at home We have all had colds.



It was really pleasant again to hear the sound of the flute accompanied by voices around the centre table

6 Thursday The daughter of Mr & Mrs Crabb, a beautiful young lady recently arrived at this place, eloped with a young(!) man by the name of Collins, a Jew & were married by Revd Lowell Smith

8th Sat Warren arrived this AM just after family worship having taken an early start No one knows how anxiously I feel for his temporal success He does not seem to have got into the right place If the Lord does open the way before him & grant him prosperity The glory shall be his -- We had Mrs Alexander to tea & to spend the evening -- Warren & I called at Mr Ii's to acknowledge the favor of the loan of the horse -- I had an application to take a boarder to day Mr Richardson who may come next week -- The Mission Churches to have a communion(?) to morrow -- We had no preparatory lecture -- This is another letting down

9 Sab I did not attend public worship in the morning but spent it in meditation reading up the Bible & in prayer

The Mission Church met at 4 P M in the Stone Church to commemorate the Saviour'(!) dying love Mr Dole preached Mr Hitchcock assisted in the communion service.

13 The Eliza Warwick has arrived and has again brought(!) grave stones to replace my husband's broken ones. Recd 2 letters via Cape Horn from M.J. & H.A.

14 I close another week & one of unusual anxiety Had been writing to my absent children -- Had a call from Consul Allen just returned from the U.S.

15 Sab(!) Heard Mr T. preach twice Text in the A M The (!) is sorrow upon the sea. It was designed for seamen -- In the evening His text was Goodness is profitable unto all things &c A most solemn(!) & impressive sermon at the close of which Mrs Carter & Capt. Lyme were married Only 15 months since Capt Carter died in the delirium tremens(?). O what a contrast was his end to to (!) that of the good man whose end is peace

16 Monday(!) Warren left for Waialua. I sent to the Post Office letters for the U S via San Francisco

19 Wed The anniversary of the sailing of the Montcal(!) the vessel which took my daughters to the U.S. Most rapidly have these two years sped their

flight -- Mr Holman came to board.

22 Sat Called with Mrs Clark on Mrs Crabb whose husband is sick (disease a softning of the brain) and whose only daughter has recently been married & gone to China Truly A stranger in a strange land & in affliction is She. We next called on Mrs Cartright(!) who arrived last Wed in the Eliza Warwick and on Sabbath her youngest child an infant of two years died in convulsion a fit. We are traveling through a vale of tears. Have shed some myself to day -- Am So perplexed about taking boarders and reluctant to give up our habits of religious worship. I lift my waiting eyes to God from him is all my aid

23 Sab Attended Service at the Bethel and heard Mr T preach a most excellent sermon from the text The Lord's hand is not shortned(!) that it cannot save neither is his ear heavy that it will not hear but your iniquities have separated (?). The sermon made a good impression on my Mind & it seemed so applicable to a case that I did hope it would make a deep impression but I was disappointed

Nov 24/51 Monday Morn. A Star has gone out in our house & my heart mourns as for one who has departed. O the sadness that weigs(!) down my spirits!

25 Still oppressed -- Labour in vain -- sorrow is mine which I can only disclose to God. -- May he bring good out of what is so crushing to my spirits. Save Lord the children of thine hand maid & hear prayer O thou prayer hearing God.

26 Wednesday Mrs Lowell Smith had a son last evening I called up on Mrs Taylor & Hall & Dimond & Mr S passing along in his carriage took me up to see his wife & child On my return called on Mrs Judd who with her three daughters were very courteous.

My spirits are lightned(!) I have referred all to God Trials, if sanctified will do me good

13 Sat A busy day My native woman sick Wrote a letter to H.J. & M.A. (in a week 4 evngs)(!)

14 Sab Went to Chapel & heard Mr T preach from the text The Lord will search Jerusalem as with candles a very searching sermon In the eve it rained & prevented my attendance

15 Monday The teachers & schollars at Punahou moved into their New school house.

16 Tuesday Sent four sheets via S Francisco to my children by the Golden Rule.

18 Thursday Thanksgiving. All our family at home We had Mr & Mrs Whitney & little Hervey to dinner

19 I called at Mrs Patterson's & Hoffnian's and on the Queen Had the honor to be received into the King's palace bed room

20 Sat eve Had a very interesting conversation with \_\_\_\_\_ My son expects to be absent next week. Cast all thy care on Him who careth for thee

21 Sab Heard Mr T at the chapel preach twice Text in the morn the children of this world are in their generation wiser than the children of light The subject in the evening was that of the return of the prodigal son

22 Monday Warren & A Clark set out for Kaneohe to go round the island via Maialua. -- (submission submit)(!)

23 Tuesday Mrs Cooke was confined with a son at nine this A M Dr Newcomb & myself were the only persons present out of the family -- Mrs W called up &

she with Mrs Clark took a cup of coffee with me

25 Thursday Christmas A very quiet day at home marked only by a present of a nice bonnet & dress for Isabella from Mrs Dominis -- The gentlemen rode to Dimond Point & were absent from Dinner -- We had stuffed baked fish & a variety of vegetables for supper.

26 I go in every morn to wash & dress Mrs C's babe To day she has had a high fever & has been in great distress Two physicians called -- we feel some anxiety for her.

27 Sat The last one in the year -- I have tried to improv(!) it in doing good O that I may be instrumental in some way of doing good -- I have heard through Mrs Richard(!) of my daughters -- No Mail yet -- Made cake for Sarai whose adopted daughter is to be married next week.

28 Sab Heard Mr T preach in the morn from the text Look unto the Rock whence you are hewn(?) & to the side of the pit whence ye were taken It was a retrospective sermon -- In the evening For what is your life A solemn sermon adopted to the close of the year.

Mary II was married to Mr Griswold at her father's house by Mr Taylor after the close of the evening service.

29 Monday Call'd over at Mr II & saw the bride The young pair are going to move into the valley

30 Spent part of the P M in a social call to Mrs Castle

31 Called down at Mr Taylor's study to purchase Bibles for New Year's Gifts for my children -- Wished to attend the preparatory lecture at the Chapel but could not find company All my children took tea at Punahou

January 1 1852 Thursday (Messers Armg(!) teacher Lee Doctors Judd Lathrop & Hardy Mr Hall Mr Bishop Whitney Messers Davis Hatcher & Stochen(?) lawyer Harris Mr Myllie &c &c &c)

Had above 20 calls from gentlemen presenting the compliments of the season Not a very happy day after all Why should I regret passing time except to improve it to better purpose. Had an invitation to attend a party at Mrs Judd's It is the second of the kind that I have recently declined. I do not enjoy them. No Mail yet.

Aug 19 Mr H paid me 14 50(!) for board.

22 Attended Service at the Stone Church & heard Mr A preach to the people on the duty of supporting their pastor

Attended also the Chapel

23 Tuesday Mr Boardman is putting up the town clock & dined with us

25 Thursday I walked up to Dr J's & spent the day & C brought me home in the carriage Made some inquiries of D J about land for Warren

27 Mrs Rice & two children came down to dine with Mr Boardman also Mr Bishop took tea & spent the night

28 Calld over at Mr Am g's(!) but found no body at home

Spirit depressed mind unsettled

29 Last Sat in the year Attended the Chap & heard Mr D preach on the importance of improving time(?) Attended the Stone C in the P M & at the C again in the eving(!)

31 Thanksgiving appointed by the King All the fa---- but myself attended the service at Chapel I denied myself to attend to domestic concerns Mr & Mrs W & Isal(!) dined at Mr L Smith's Mr G & the boys dined at home
