Notes:

- 1. *Kemalani* Mr. Levi Chamberlain was a member of the second company of missionaries. He was the superintendent of secular affairs for the mission and served as a missionary teacher.
- 2. *Kekuanaoa* Mataio Kekūanāoʻa, of chiefly descent, was first married to Kalani Pauahi and then to Elizabeth Kīnaʻu. He was the Royal Governor of the island of Oʻahu from 1834-1868, a member of the House of Nobles and Privy Council, the 6th Kuhina Nui (regent) and the father of Kamehameha IV and Kamehameha V.
- 3. *C. Kanaina* Charles Kana'ina was a man of chiefly lineage who married Miriam 'Auhea Kekāuluohi. Their son, Willian Charles Lunalilo, became the sixth monarch of the Hawaiian Kingdom.
