My dear Mr. L.

I have been trying all day to get a moments time to write you and now it is almost sunset - but no time for apologies. We are not very comfortably settled yet - I can get but little time to do anything but take care of the little folks. They are all pretty well but baby is growing and is ready to laugh at every body he sees - I am pretty much perplexed - one foot has a blister on the bottom as large as a quarter of a dollar and a small one on the ankle - We are afraid to leave off his shoes for them to heal - What shall we do? His ever being able to use his feet depends upon the present mode of treatment - for the responsibility is more than I feel able to bear - I feel the full force of Dr. Stock's remark "that we ought to be near a physician this year" - I send you my thanks for your - I wanted to send a few eggs but Mrs. S. says the man has a heavy load so I will wait till next time - May the Lord reward you a thousand fold for all that you have done for me and mine much love to Maria & Martha A. and the boys -
